Mr.Dust started teaching here in 1969 as a social studies teacher and continued to work here not only as a teacher but as a coach for the cross country teams and track & field teams for 37 years. He was able to retire from the school in 2006. Mr. Dust was known to be very humorous and very caring for his students. He was the main cause for the school even having a girls' cross country team as it was seen more as a boys' sport at that time. He also coached girls' softball for several seasons. All of the staff at T.F. South adored and respected him as a teacher. One of those teachers was Mr. Seibel, A current teacher and head boys cross-country coach here at T.F. South. "He was a great coach and impacted the way I coach today," stated Seibel. "He was always helping out around the whole community with all the organizations he was involved in." "He taught me to always have pride in T.F South and what we can accomplish together." Seibel continued, "I'd describe him as committed vet it would be hard to describe him with only one word honestly". Another one of those teachers is his daughter Mrs. Belli, current math teacher and head girls track coach. "It's hard to say since it's been so much but for me, he set a good example to stick to your values, act with integrity, and love the community you are in and stick with it."

"He taught me that things can get hard for everyone so you have to adapt to your situation, don't focus on the negative, and focus on what you can control." "If I could describe him with one word

I'd describe him as very encouraging." Mr.Dust passed away peacefully in his home on Jan 26, 2024 at the age of 77. We continue to honor him and the effect he had not only on T.F South, but the whold community of Lansing. He will forever be remembered as he was added to the T.F South Athletic Hall of Fame, the school named the track at T.F South as the "Rich Dust Track", and annually hosts a cross country invitational named the Rich Dust Invitational. Richard Dust will forever be remembered in the Village of Lansing.

On December 20th of 2024, the beloved Thornton Fractional South teacher, Julie Tovey-Laschober, passed away. Tovey-Laschober had a long teacher career, spanning a little more than 27 years and had a tremendous impact on the school. Tovey-Laschober was a mentor, friend, and teacher to many at TF South and her time here will never be forgotten. Unfortunately, she had to step away from her teaching duties for a while to focus on her health but those at TF South had a lot of positive and heartfelt things to say about her. Leo Bonin, a math teacher at TF South, had warm sentiments to say about his colleague. Bonin described happier times, stating "that the best part of my day was coming and having coffee, called the 'coffee clutch,' ... those moments were dear to me because like for a half hour every day, we'd sit there and [just talk]." As a result of Tovey-Laschober's leave, some students missed the opportunity to have her as a teacher and mentor at TF South. However, those who knew her had nothing but good things to say. Nicole Burk, a counselor at TF South described her as "was

one of the most patient and generous people I have known. She had a quick wit and realistic attitude toward life that helped put challenges into perspective... [she] liked to joke about my 'bleeding heart,' but she also had a soft side that was receptive to understanding the concerns of others and a willingness to extend additional support when needed." Burk stated also that Tovey-Laschober, "faced challenges with problemsolving practicality and wasted no time on drama". Additionally, Bonin felt that people should know she was a "smart lady... [and] very, very passionate about teaching. She wanted the best out of kids.. but she was not going to coddle you [either]". Burk reinforced this by commenting how Tovey-Laschober, "had high expectations for her students and wanted to prepare them for success in life after high school." It's admirable how Tovey-Laschober truly cared so much for her students and her dedication to teaching the youth. While death is always sad, it also puts life into perspective. It helps us realize that life really is too short and we need to take the time to appreciate the people around us. Tovey-Laschober's life and contributions were meaningful and as Burk states, "she was an amazing mother and a wonderful friend who is deeply missed!". The community, students and staff at TF South, and her family will remember Tovey-Laschober's impact on them. Bonin said it best when stating, "I do miss my friend a lot and I hope that everybody else who remembers her thinks well of her and enjoys the memories they have".





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


Variety of Langage classes at IF South is foreign

According to the most current National K-16 Foreign Language **Enrollment Survey** Report from 2017 about 20% of the total school age population is enrolled in a foreign language course. Illinois currently does not require a foreign language class in order to graduate high school. However, students entering the ninth grade in the 2028-29 school year and every year after must complete two years of world language as a prerequisite to receiving a high school diploma per the Illinois State Board of Education, Illinois Graduation requirements. Some colleges such as the University of Southern California require 2-4 years of foreign language for

undergraduate students to be considered for admission, and the University of Chicago recommends 2-3 years of foreign language. At TF South there are about 600+ students

of 20% enrollment in a foreign language. French and Spanish are the only foreign language courses available and there are five foreign language teachers in total out of by providing more opportunities. Such as study abroad opportunities in high school and college, more job opportunities, etc. These incentives and or opportunities



enrolled in a foreign language class out of 1,783 students, that is about 34% which is slightly higher than the national average about 140 staff members. Learning a foreign language not only broadens students' views culturally but is beneficial to students

could be accessible to students around the United States by an assortment of language courses being offered. With more courses available not only will the national average of foreign language enrollments increase and have positive effects on the student body. Schools should allocate a certain amount of money to hiring more experienced foreign language teachers. The most common languages taught in schools are Spanish and French, but all students should have the chance to have more options. Communication with others is paramount to building new relationships, resolving conflicts, and can even help someone to understand themselves better.

Locker Searches




For three games and food for two, I would say that is a very good deal. I expected to spend a little more than that coming in so it was a decent surprise. Overall I had a great
